Date and Remarks	Orders of the Tribunal
Item No. 08 29th January, 2014	Two replies dtd 21.01.2014 and 28.01.2014 have been filed which were prepared by the Bhopal Municipal Corporation, Bhopal (BMC) after the Monitoring Committee Members visited the site where cleaning operation is going on in the Shahpura Lake and the Nalahs which flow into it. Shri Asad Ullah Khan, Learned Counsel for the BMC submits that the work is going slowly as a result of harsh winter and intermittent rains in the past one week and therefore another 10 days time may be allowed to complete the task of cleaning the Shahpura Lake and Nalahs as directed by the Tribunal including the progress of fixing Jali as it has been given out that suitable points for the same have already been identified. As the BMC has sought 10 days time we expect that the aforesaid work would be completed by 09.02.2014. Thereafter, we direct that the Mayor, Bhopal shall personally inspect the Shahpura Lake and the sites where the cleaning operation for removal of the solid waste is being done by the BMC alongwith the Members of the Committee and report on the progress of the

work being carried out including that of fixing Jalis as directed by this Tribunal on the suggestions of the Learned Engineer of the BMC for regulating the flow and checking entry of solid waste into lake through Nalahs. The Mayor is directed to file an affidavit as to whether she is satisfied with the work done and what further effective steps the BMC intends to take in this regard to check the entry of solid waste through the Nalahs into the Shahpura Lake as well as for regular monitoring and cleaning of the Nalahs and Shahpura Lake with name and designation of the officers and staff of the BMC who shall be responsible for undertaking this task in future on a regular basis so that they can be made accountable.

The Learned Counsel for the BMC is directed to forward a copy of this order to the Mayor of the BMC.
