Well known author of 28 books on various topics of environment and chemistry, Dr. Subhash C. Pandey is the Editor-In-Chief of international research magazine JERAD (Journal of Environment Research And Development). He has organized 5 national and 7 international seminars on environment so far, just to facilitate and gather the scientists, professors, research scholars and environmentalists from India and abroad on a single platform. International seminar organized at University of Mauritius was well esteemed and admired by the Lok Sabha (lower house) of India on December 01, 2010 where honorable minister for state on environment gave a written statement before the house. Dr. Pandey was a professor and head in the field of environment and chemistry in a government collage associated with the Barkatullah University, Bhopal, India. But he took voluntary retirement from the government service having 17 years of his services remaining. His object was to do some ground zero work for the sake and welfare of the society in general, and environment in particular. Honored with many international and national awards, Dr. Pandey has also guided many researchers for Ph.D. and otherwise. To do some actual work in the field of social justice and environment, Dr. Pandey, under aegis of G.SEED, has been adopting naked hills, dirty and neglected ponds and lakes, and undeveloped villages. Ratan Talaw and Furza slum area of Bharuch (Gujarat), Rasoolpura village near Aurangabad (Maharashtra), Anand Nagar Shamshan Ghat (cremation center), Shahpura Lake, Lower Lake, Upper Lake, Laharpur Dam of Bhopal and Sagar lake of Sagar (Madhya Pradesh) are testimony to the remarkable work being done for cleaning, conserving and developing various sites. A grand Neem jungle (Neem forest) has also been developed on the naked hill top of Chunna Bhatti hill near MANIT, Bhopal. Besides, he has also been pursuing, in public interest, various petitions in the National Green Tribunals for environmental causes.

Some of his efforts through the National Green Tribunal may be highlighted as below:

1. Got success in prohibition and regulation of immersion of Idols and Tazias in the drinking water bodies of state of Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan.
2. Got success in prohibition on manufacture, storage, sale and use of fire crackers above the strength of 125 dB in the various state of India.
3. Got success in stopping the cultivation and sale of vegetables and crops irrigated with untreated sewage and polluted water in the state of Madhya Pradesh.
4. Managed to Persuade the NGT to issue direction to the government of Madhya Pradesh to provide immediate assistance to hailstorm affected 29 lakh farmer families of state of Madhya Pradesh in order to maintain and improve the regional local environment.
5. Got success in stopping burning of straw (Agricultural residues) at farm. In the state of Madhya Pradesh, it has now become illegal to burn the fodder in the field.
6. Got success in making it mandatory the use of straw reaper along with harvester used for the harvesting of wheat, paddy and other crops in the state of Madhya Pradesh.
7. Got success in issuance of directions to the government authorities to take immediate effective measures against industries polluting water, soil and ambient air quality of the industrial area, Mandideep, Bhopal (M.P.).
8. Got success in issuance of directions to M.P. state government, Pollution Control Board and Municipality to take effective steps for protection and conservation of the archeological monuments and human habitation at Mandideep Industrial area, Bhopal.
9. Got a grand success in putting breaks on the use of "Bhanpur Khanti", which had been functioning as an unauthorized dumping site and illegal trenching ground of city of Bhopal.
10. Got success in persuading NGT to pass strong directions to the states of Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh for the scientific disposal of

municipal solid waste in all the municipalities of the state.

11. Got success in issuance of directions and a prohibitory order to the private builders and government organizations for the conservation of Kaliasote river of Bhopal city. The Tribunal had directed to clean and clear all encroachments on the river bed and green belt area of the river.
12. Got success in issuance of directions for the cleaning and conservation of Shahpura pond of Bhopal. Continuous monitoring and cleaning of water body is slowly doing wonders in reconverting a neglected sewage pond into a lake. On the orders of NGT, government is doing expenditure of INR 34 crore for conservation of the lake.

Besides, many scams related to corruption and social justice has also been uncovered using RTI applications filled in various cities of India. For eg :

- a) Exposed the UGC scam of lakhs of Rupees in the name of foreign tour and research paper presentation, being committed by vice chancellors, principals and professors of M.P. Higher Education Department and others. A Criminal prosecution is being sought by filing an application for sanction to prosecute, in which Dr. Pandey is going to act as a Prosecutor in his private capacity.
- b) Got success in exposing SBI (SVNIT campus, Surat, Gujarat) Bank's scam of opening illegal Bank account and its unauthorized irregular operation. Finally the Bank was compelled to close the account.
- c) Got success in exposing income tax evaders and irregularities being done by government collages of Madhya Pradesh while holding of various outdoor exams in their campus.
- d) Got success in exposing corruption in transfer of government employees being done by M.P. government.
- e) Got success in exposing the irregularities and scam of crores in the swami vivekanand carrer margdarshan yogana run by Madhya Pradesh government.
- f) Exposed the eye donation scam at eye centers of various private and government hospitals of M.P.
- g) Grand disclosure of exploitation in the salaries provided to teachers working

in the private schools of Madhya Pradesh.

- h) Exposure of sexual harassment and misconduct of teenagers on the name of "Rise Dance" happened at "Kareela fest" at Ashok Nagar, Madhya Pradesh.
- i) Disclosure of adulteration in milk and manufacture of harmful artificial milk at various cities of Madhya Pradesh.
